Important Deadlines


The following are gentle reminders of some deadlines. Adhering to these dates make all our volunteer jobs easier.

Have done lots of other projects but look forward to getting back to 'in person with friends' classes and sewing times. Hope you are well. Take care.










Update from the Nominating Committee by Alice Kish

They Couldn't Vote, but... "1920 Challenge"



Your challenge leaders have selected 15 period blocks, both pieced and appliqued, and we invite you to adapt, interpret or reproduce one or more of these blocks in a small challenge quilt.


The only parameter for the challenge other than the blocks is the quilt size. It must be *no bigger than* 160" in circumference, e.g., 40"x40," 20"x60," 30"x50," a 50" diameter circle, a hexagon with 25" sides.

The due date for the entries will be updated when we are able to meet again. The entries will be judged, and there will be prizes for the top three winners. So get those creative juices flowing and join the fun celebrating our hard won right to vote!

The chosen blocks will be sent to all members in a separate email. When you get it you will see that they are "old time patterns" from a long out-of-print book, 101 Patchwork Patterns by Ruby McKim. Be sure to read the descriptions!

Let us know if you are doing this challenge. We want to still hold it when the time is right!






And from Nita Brayton

I used a "gifted" embroidered and stained linen luncheon napkin to make a mask. I plan on wearing masks for an indefinite period of time so found a use for napkins.






Jean Rhian makes her Londonderry neighborhood colorful with lots of changing quilt displays!



Outreach's July work!!! It's amazing what has come in, in a month! You'll see names repeated. Chris tries to remember to take a picture when work leaves Aggravation Acres and comes back when that step is finished. Such as: once quilted, quilt, binding and label will go to someone to apply (picture taken). Then that quilt is returned (picture taken). Next it is ready for someone to finish the binding with handwork (picture taken). When that quilt is returned (picture taken), its journey to completion is over. Quilts are then sorted into tubs as to where it's finally going to go. Not all projects are quilts. Once a month, Chris makes delivery to the organizations needing the quilts and other items. Look closely; one of those tops may have been one you donated or made for Outreach. This month there were quilts as well as pillows, books, bibs, afghans, placemats and burp cloths. The completed items and quilts went to: Caroline Family Service Center (Talbot Early Head Start was not in need), UMSRH Hospital 2 East/Pain Palliative Care Unit, Talbot Hospice, UMSRH Clark Breast Center, and Chapel District Elementary School Parent Teacher's Organization.







Outreach has been busy!
