

Bonnie loves to share her quilt and fabric collections, quilt history knowledge, and her quilt making expertise with interested groups, whether it is a hands-on workshop, a display of historic quilts, or a themed trunk show.

Bonnie is traveling from central Maine to share her story!

A Century+ of American Quilts

This trunk show includes examples of quilts from mid-19th through mid-20th Century. Bonnie brings a minimum of 25 quilts from her own collection that are representative of American quilting trends spanning 100 years. Participants are urged to bring quilts for discussion.

This fun nine-block wall hanging top can be completed in an afternoon. The slashing technique can be simple, as shown here, or made more complex by adding a third or fourth "stick" in each block. Or, you may decide to piece the "sticks" to add interest. The pictured quilt was made with all solid fabrics, but a different look will be achieved by using prints. It's your choice!

It helps to bring your sense of play to this workshop. This is very much an exercise in letting go of one's desire for precision piecing! It's best to approach this workshop with an open, free-wheeling attitude! This workshop is meant to be FUN!

NOTE: If a class is not sold out two months ahead, it will be opened up to other area quilt guilds. This policy will apply to all classes going forward.



Lecture: April 8, 9:30AM Marisela Rumberg "Legends, Stories, Traditions, and Quilts"

Marisela is an award winning quilter and teacher. Quilting was once a hobby but now it's her passion and she loves to say "I'm a quilter."

Marisela has won awards at many quilt shows and hasbeen featured in quilt shows around the world, including at the

Houston International Quilt Festival, the Patchwork and Quilt Expo in Mexico, the Quilt and Patchwork Festival in Grammado, Brazil, The Festival of Quilts in Birmingham, England, Quilt Expo Beaujolais in France and at the International Quilt Festival in Suzdal, Russia.

She is a member of Studio Fiber Arts at the Workhouse Arts Center in Lorton, Virginia, where I currently create and exhibit my art, and recently became a Certified Zentangle Teacher.

My classes and workshops are designed to inspire and set your inner artist free.

prizes for the top three winners. So get those creative juices flowing and join the fun celebrating our hard won right to vote!





Fiber Arts Group Meeting on MD's Lower Eastern Shore


