# BAYSIDE MEETING MINUTES

## October 13, 2021

A quorum of members being present, the monthly meeting of Bayside Quilters, held at Trappe VFD, was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Sharon Miller, President.

Sharon Perry, Membership Chair, announced that 114 members paid dues for this coming year. While that is less than we had in 2019, it is much better than we expected after the disruption due to the pandemic.

The next session of Quilt Camp to benefit the Trappe Volunteer Fire Department will be held on October 22-23. There are 2 openings left. Please contact Lou Diefenderfer if you are interested.

Jackie Granger is organizing a 50/50 raffle in which Bayside will get 50% of the proceeds and the winner of the raffle will get the other 50%. The ticket price is \$1 per ticket or \$5 for 6 tickets, which were available for purchase at the end of the meeting. They will also be available at the November meeting and at the December meeting before the luncheon. The drawing will be at the end of the Christmas party. Please support Bayside in this fundraiser since we are running a budget deficit due to the decrease in membership.

Sharon Miller announced that she was contacted by someone who is handling a sale of sewing accessories, including sewing machines, an Accuquilt Go cutter and other items. Please contact Sharon if you are interested.

Shirley Windsor is providing promotional information for Robin Hood Shop sales, which is the charitable organization that takes the items remaining on our free tables. The proceeds of sales go to Dorchester General Hospital in Cambridge.

Lou Diefenderfer moved to accept the minutes from the September Bayside meeting. Chris Dorset seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

A financial report was not available at the October meeting since both Lisa Schober and Dael Cowdrey were not able to attend. They will provide the report at the November meeting.

Kay Butler provided a summary of the FACES activities, including several upcoming classes, the current exhibition ("200 Years of Solid Color Quilts: A Quilt Study" through December 31), and UFO sessions of 3 days for \$25.

Chris Dorset read thank you notes from several of the organizations receiving Outreach quilts, including Talbot County Hospital, Early Head Start, and the Talbot Interfaith Shelter.

Chris also reminded us that the Ocean City Retreat will be held February 20-24, 2022, and that you must be registered by November 17. Please sign up soon with Jan Bohn or Carol Clarke.

Sharon Perry, Jackie Granger and Jo Verne are organizing the Bayside Christmas party for 2021. The plan is to serve soups and salads, with everyone bringing cookies or another dessert. Please contact Jo if you want to contribute a soup or salad. It will be \$10 per person and it will be held at the Trappe Firehouse on December 8.

Jo Verne announced that Talbot County Humane Society will sponsor a pet-themed Christmas boutique on the grounds of Saints Peter and Paul Church in Easton, opening on November 12. She invited quilters and crafters to sell items on consignment at the shop. Contact Jo if you are interested.

In November, we will have a Zoom lecture and trunk show on "Visualizing Quilts" by Ann Shaw.

Our guest speaker in October was Julia Graves, who made a presentation titled "Make It Your Own – Design Guidelines for Quilters." Her guidance for personalizing quilt designs included a discussion of color value, intensity and temperature; various elements of design including shape, size, pattern and texture; and principles of design such as variety and proportion, balance, repetition, focal point, harmony, and movement. She provided many examples of quilts and design images, as well as a list of resources for further investigation.

Show and Tell followed a short break.

The meeting was adjourned. The next meeting will be held on November 10 at the Trappe Volunteer Firehouse.

My quilting philosophy is this.....I believe that each quilt is special and deserves quilting that accentuates it’s beauty and uniqueness.”
