Minutes of the Regular Meeting of Bayside Quilt Guild

October 12, 2022

A quorum being present, President Pat Massimini called the meeting of the Bayside Quilt Guild to order. The meeting was held at the Trappe Volunteer Fire Department and via Zoom. New members, Katie Bertram and Etta Stewart were introduced. We currently have paid membership of 80 members. Pat suggested we start a mentoring program to welcome new members and asked for volunteers.

Other announcements included: we are rethinking Outreach, Jackie Granger has website information, and a new order for the meeting will be that Show & Tell will take place before the program. Pat acknowledged Sharon Miller's good work putting out our monthly newsletter.

The Board has decided not to host the Bayside Camps as the Trappe VFD is holding monthly Quilt Camp as a fundraiser for the fire department. All are welcome to sign up for this with Lou Diefenderfer.

There being no corrections, the minutes of the September meeting were approved.

Kris Smith gave the treasurer's report. Our membership is down and therefore, our income is also. We continue to operate at a deficit.

General Announcements:

Candy Stiffler, Program Chair, outlined the coming program schedule. March will be Barbara Cline for an in-person program and a full day class to follow. February will be our Outreach Sew-In. January the Modern Bee will be presenting the program following their self-portrait challenge of December. December will be the Annual Christmas Luncheon. November speaker will be Lyric Kinard via Zoom showing Artistic Quilts. The class will be presented by our own Marianne Hamilton, assisted by Dael Cowdry, on Wool Applique. Marianne will be ordering kits for a Christmas pillow cover. If interested, please see her for more information.

Jan Bohn, Outreach Chair, read a thank you note from Judith Parker at Hospice. Michele Hegedorn has made stocking kits which can be picked up and returned. Lou Diefenderfer and Jo Verne have made mammo pillows and there will be a "pop-up" sew-in today following lunch to make more. Jan suggested a Workshop might be useful in learning different ways to quilt Outreach quilts on a home machine.

An announcement was also made that Lois Krebs is having a sale of her quilting fabrics and supplies Oct. 17, 18, 19 at her home. Sharon Miller will send out information.

Jackie Granger updated information on the Hand Made Sale fundraiser which will be held at the Trappe VFD on November 18th & 19th. All items must be hand made, completed items only; no fabric or precuts or notions. The maker will receive 70% and Bayside 30%. Anyone participating should see Jackie for a vendor number. Each vendor should price their own items and tag them (no straight pins) with their vendor number on the tag. Categories were outlined. There will be a meeting following this meeting to discuss details. Lots of volunteers will be needed to set-up, act as cashiers, white-glove ladies, take-down, etc. Margaret Roberts has been handling advertising and Sharon Miller and Lou Diefenderfer have made rack cards which can be placed in businesses and public spaces. Please take several to distribute. We will have a banner on the YMCA fence. Debbie Brobst is handling on-line advertising. Jen Latham is putting a notice in Attractions Magazine and an ad will be placed in The Register. Trappe VFD is generously waiving the rental fee.

Alice Kisch and Jo Verne and others are holding a quilter's garage sale at Alice's house on Saturday, October 15 from 9-3. Sellers will donate 10% of proceeds to Bayside. As well, there will be some items that will be sold 100% on behalf of the guild.

Lou Diefenderfer made an announcement regarding the Trappe VFD Quilt Camps. The cost is \$25 for one day, \$40 for two and \$50 for three.

Carol Clarke gave an update on the search for a new venue for the winter retreat. Several inquiries have been made but we have not heard back from most. Camp Pecometh is looking like a good possibility.

Because of the need to proceed with the program, Show & Tell was postponed until after the meeting. Pat then introduced our speaker for this month, Sally Manke, who came to us by Zoom. Sally, a fabric artist, gave a trunk show of her artwork. She can be seen on Facebook, has an Etsy store ([sallymanke.etsy.com](https://www.etsy.com/shop/sallymanke)) and a website ([sallymanke.com](https://www.sallymanke.com)). For a few days, she is offering guild members a discount using the code TRUNK 10.

Show and Tell followed and the meeting was adjourned

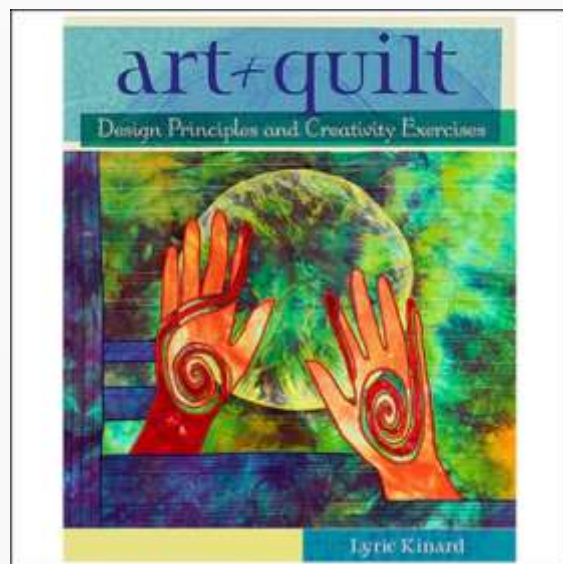
