

October 13, 2021 at 9:30 AM Trappe Volunteer Fire Department Make It Your Own – Design Guidelines for Quilters Lecture by Julia Graves



Hi, I'm Julia Graves, a quilter, teacher and artist, and owner of Special Occasion Quilts (soquilts.com). I did my apprenticeship as a quilter by making a quilt for each of my nieces and nephews (I should have counted them all before I made this promise to them – there were 35!). They got to choose their colors, so I greatly expanded my repertoire of color schemes!

A highlight of my career so far has been as Artist in Residence at Empty Spools Seminars at Asilomar CA in 2019. I was scheduled to be an instructor there teaching Amazing Abstracts in 2021 (darn Covid!) but am happy to say I am booked there again in April 2022 and teaching with Hudson River Valley Art

Workshops in December 2022.

Make It Your Own – Design Guidelines for Quilters

Who hasn't loved a pattern, but wanted to make it in different colors or a different size? Or had ideas for quilts but didn't know where to start? Julia presents foundational design principles in easy to understand concepts to help guide your choices. While the examples feature traditional quilts, there's plenty here for the art quilter as well. Good design is good design no matter where it's applied!

This lecture presents an overview of Ann's approach to designing quilts and the how differing choices can influence the look of a quilt. She discusses the use of "Gesture" as a guide to creating pieceable quilt designs and describes how the characteristics of printed fabrics that contribute to the overall look of a quilt. A series of examples illustrate her design process, from creating a pattern to unusual fabric choices

She is happy to answer questions from the audience during her presentation. She also shows some of her quilts at the end of the presentation.




