Bayside Quilters Meeting Minutes

March 12, 2025

The March Meeting of the Bayside Quilters was held at the Trappe Volunteer Fire Company. A quorum was present in person and the meeting was called to order by President Jackie Granger at 9:32 a.m.

Announcements: Jackie welcomed everyone to the meeting, including two guests. She announced that instead of a traditional nametag drawing, we would be having a door prize drawing, generously sponsored by Katie Wyatt and Jافتex.

Secretary's Report: The minutes were approved as written.

Treasurer's Report: Kris Smith presented the Treasurer's Report.

Old Business: Jackie announced that this year's retreat was a success. Thank you to Jan Bohn for organizing and for everyone who participated.

Karli Abbott thanked everyone who donated and volunteered for the 4-H Sewing Classes this year. There were 25 4-H members from three counties who participated.

Handmade Market: Pat Massimini and Jackie will co-chair the Handmade Market this year. They met this week to begin planning and will discuss ideas for the sale, including recommended items to make at each monthly meeting

Membership: It was announced that the guild has reached 100 members. Members who have not yet picked up their membership books are reminded to do so.

Programs: Space is still available for the upcoming programs this month and next month. Members interested in attending are encouraged to sign up.

Outreach: Jackie distributed surveys to gather information on the types of outreach projects members are willing to assist with. Pat asked for member input regarding organizations and ideas for future projects. The committee is seeking volunteers to help make items and serve as points of contact for different organizations.

New Business: Julia Cahoon announced that the Modern Quilt Bee will display their Self-Portrait and Color Challenges at the Fiber Arts Center of the Eastern Shore in Denton from August 6th to October 11th. An opening reception will be held on August 9th from 1-4 p.m. Members of the Modern Bee who have not yet submitted their bios and descriptions are asked to do so immediately.

Jackie announced that Bayside Quilters has been invited to display quilts at the Talbot County Public Library in the main library room for the year. Nita Brayton answered questions regarding the plans. While quilt sizes are not yet finalized, it was suggested that quilts be no longer than 72 inches to accommodate the hanging space. Submitting a quilt does not guarantee its display, as Kin West will be designing the space and selecting the quilts. Forms will be available in the newsletter and at the next meeting. Members are asked to submit photos and forms by June 1st. Nita will be available after meetings to take photos of quilts if needed. An intake committee will also be formed. Quilts should be brought in a pillowcase with the owner's name written on it. There is no specific theme, and quilts do not require sleeves for hanging. However, members with quilts needed for other events, such as the Modern Bee's Self-Portrait and Color Challenge at FACES in August, are asked not to submit those quilts for this exhibit.

Tyra shared that Chris Dorset is doing much better and will soon be moving to an assisted living facility

Following the reports, our speaker was announced as our very own member, Gail Lee. She gave an excellent presentation and members loved seeing her work.

First Ever Afternoon Open Sew

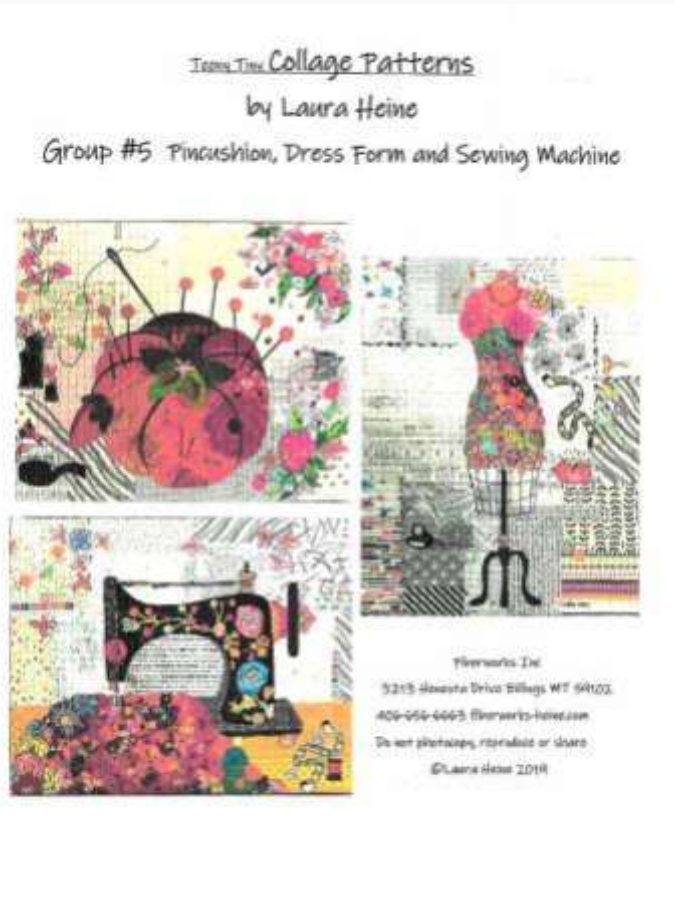
You asked for some open sew time – and we listened!

**Laura Heine Collage
Workshop**

In this class, we will learn how to make one of the Laura Heine Collage Quilts. We will be using Laura Heine's Pincushion pattern, and everyone will be working to create their own style. Or if you have completed Laura Heine's Teeny Tiny pincushion, you are welcome to use another teeny tiny pattern. I would avoid the Teeny Tiny patterns that use the small strips (Ex: Abilene the cow). That is a different technique we will not be covering. You will learn why we use Steam-A-Seam 2 for applique pieces. Master the cutting and trimming of applique pieces. We will be working on the collage part of the pattern, but I will give ideas for finishing your project.



Collage: An assemblage ... of diverse elements or fragments in unlikely or unexpected juxtaposition. The Laura Heine Method



I like to make collage pieces; therefore, I participated in a workshop at The Crabby Quilter in January. Cathy is a certified Laura Heine instructor and part owner of the store. Bayside Quilters has an opportunity to participate in the collage workshop in April. To participate you will need Laura's pattern (available from Cathy) which has three designs, a tomato pincushion, a sewing machine, and a dress form. Cathy allowed me to attempt the sewing machine. The others did the tomato. I should have done the tomato. We all left with a good basic knowledge of the Laura Heine method and a nearly completed project.

Cathy will have a kit available for \$35, otherwise the supply list can get a bit expensive, and no sewing machine required. The most expensive item is the Laura Heine pressing mat & Teflon pressing sheet. Unless you want to make multiple collages, bring a protective fabric or Teflon sheets to protect the iron board and iron. I recommend using the tomato pattern. You also need pattern ease to design and build the collage. Steam-a-Seam 2 is mandatory for superior results. A good, serrated scissors make cutting out the fused motifs possible. There is a lot to fuse; it takes a while to get good, fused pieces.

The Crabby Quilter classroom accommodates five students. (It is nice to have supplies or fabric readily available.) Trappe Volunteer Fire Company gives us ample space so all students can have their own ironing center. The five students shared two ironing stations which may have slowed us down a bit. There was nothing on the list that I did not use but, so far, not as much is required. I suggest you bring a broad selection of patterned fabric. The fun of making collages is to use unexpected motifs to create your personal work of art. Please search the internet for Laura Heine kits to get an idea of what you may want to use for the background.

Try it, you may unleash the artist in you.

Submitted by Nita Brayton and approved by another student, Lou Defenderfer. We will be taking the class again in April.

Needle Turn Applique Workshop

I'll show you my way of doing needle turn applique with freezer paper. You will have a choice of one or two blocks – A or B on the picture right. You can use this finished piece in many ways, a pillow, the center of a medallion wall hanging or table topper or simply framed.

I will give you a quick tutorial on making bias stems. I will have ready made stems for you to use in your block. You can opt to bring your own supplies (Supply List will be provided) or purchase a kit for \$15.
