Minutes of the Regular Meeting of Bayside Quilters July 12, 2023

The meeting at the Trappe Volunteer Fire Company hall was called to order by President Pat Massimini at 9:30 am.

Pat welcomed new members Gayle Brindley & Morna Golletz and had them introduce themselves.

President's Announcements: Pat reminded members to check out the updated Bayside website which includes an online directory under the password protected members section.

Paper copies of the directory are still available from Membership Chair Sharon Perry if you have not received one. You may also purchase an extra for \$5.

Pat made additional reminders about the August luncheon which will be held at the Trappe Firehouse on our regular meeting date of August 9th, and the Hand Made sale which is being held on November 18th & 19th.

Lastly, Pat alerted the members to a cancellation of the next board meeting which was going to be on August 1st. Instead, the incoming board will schedule a meeting in September and will let the membership know when and where it will be held. As always, any member of Bayside may attend board meetings.

Three drawings were held for members who remembered to wear their name tag. Prizes were adorable quilt panels from Jaftex Fabrics donated by Katie Wyatt their brand ambassador and Bayside member.

Treasurer's Report: Lisa Schober gave the monthly treasurer's report and announced that membership dues are remaining at \$50. She then outlined what that \$50 "buys" each member, and the additional dollars that guild monies has to cover for each member every year. The cost to the guild for each member for year end 2022 (with 112 members) was \$115.68 less \$50 left a net expense of \$65.68 per member that dues did not cover. The estimate for year ending Aug 31, 2023 (with 84 members) is \$174.03 less \$50 dues will leave a net expense of \$124.03 per member. Again, this expense is covered by guild monies, not dues, and needs to be made up each year. Comments and suggestions are as follows: the 10 % sales table is helping (consider cleaning out your closet), donations of copy paper, stamps, ink & equipment, members donating food and prizes for our events, donating long arm services for Outreach, a letter to former members asking them to re-join. If you have any other ideas, we'd love to hear them! Also, Lisa mentioned that hopefully we will have 100% participation with our major fundraiser in November. You can donate 100% of your sales to Bayside or do the 70/30 split. Last but not least, include us in your will. If we keep spending more than we bring in, we will have to continue to cut the budget or eventually cease to exist!

In response to a question about what the highest expenses are for the guild, Lisa replied "programs/lectures and room rent." Fortunately, Lou Diefenderfer has generously reduced our room rent going forward. Thank you Lou!

General Announcements

Membership dues are now being collected. Dues are \$50. A membership form must be filled out by every member even if your information has not changed. The form is in the newsletter and copies are available at the membership table. Membership can be paid by cash or check and can be paid at a guild meeting or by mail. Dues must be in no later than the September meeting (9/13) to be included in the new directory.

Judy Gross read several thank you notes from quilt recipients.

Jackie Granger made an announcement about the August luncheon which will consist of sandwiches, "make your own salads," desserts and beverages. The cost to attend is \$10/ Members are asked to bring either salad add-ins or a dessert. The luncheon is being held at the Trappe Firehouse at 11am on August 9th. In addition to lunch, we will have games and prizes and the induction of the new board members.

Jackie also spoke about the Hand Made Sale which is being held on November 18th & 19th. This is our fundraiser for this year, so everyone is urged to participate by including items in the sale. The split will be the sale as last year: 70% to the maker and 30% to Bayside. We are also happy to include anything handmade from non-Bayside members as long as they agree to the 70/30 split.

Lou Diefenderfer thanked the guild for again sponsoring the 4-H Home Furnishings competition at the Talbot County Fair which is being held on July 13-15. The \$300 that Bayside donates is used for the prizes - cash premiums and ribbons - provided to the winners.

Karli Abbott announced that she is supporting FACES by teaching classes to both children ages 8+ and adults.

Alice Kish is currently the featured quilter at FACES. Her quilts will be on display until September 11 of this year. Everyone is urged to go and see Alice's work.

Jeanne Hechmer announced that she is teaching a class at FACES called "Finishing The Edges" on October 14th.

It was decided by a majority of the members present that we will have a 50/50 raffle at each Bayside meeting going forward to raise money for the guild. Lou Diefenderfer volunteered to sell the tickets.

Following Show & Tell, Nita Brayton introduced our speaker, Cindy Grisdela. Cindy's program "the anatomy of improv" included a trunk show and information about her quilting journey. She describes her approach as "no patterns, no templates and no rules."


Eleanor Levie has presented twice before to our guild and is energized to come back


