Pat Spoke briefly about doing something different for the 2023 Holiday Luncheon. There were thoughts regarding having a more formal luncheon in the summer with a more casual Holiday Luncheon. No decision was made.

Pat shared the price quote received for doing a membership directory. Discussions were had. No decision was made.

**Pat Introduced todays Program**. "Modern Self Portrait". Members of the Modern Quilt Bee created selfportraits. There was a wide variety of creative challenges. There were also many post card size creations on display. Artists such as Freddy Morran, Timma Tarr, Laura Heine, Chuck Close, Phyliss Cullen, Leila McConnell, Wiener, Duo Amazonas were researched by quilt members for their projects.

The following members presented their completed 18" x 24" self-portraits and each gave a brief discussion on the artists that they researched for creative ideas and what their thought processes were while designing their self-portraits: Candy Stiffler, Debbie Bropst, Carol Clarke, Juia Cahoon, Nita Brayton, Jean Konopacz, Jackie Granger, Becky Combs, Pat Massimini, Sharon Miller, Laura Boehl, and Alice Kish.

The Modern Design Bee also had a quilt challenge. They were challenged with each using a color blue within their quilt. These quilts had been on display at the Talbot County Library.

Pat announced – Modern Quilters meet first Wednesday of each month at 6:30pm

Jackie reported on the Handmade Holiday Sale. Twenty-seven guild members contributed. Need commitments for next year. Total sale was ~\$19,000. Bayside profited ~ \$9,000. Raffle quilt was a great success. Jackie gave us an outline of items sold and amount collected. Thank you check was given to the Trappe Firehouse for the use of the Firehouse. It was unanimous to have a Raffle Quilt again next year.

Other comments on the Handmade Holiday Sale were: Heard from buyers that quilts were priced conservatively lower than other quilt shows. Timing was good. Adding a day was suggested but not popular. Lots of conversation and compliments on how the event was handled. Kudos were given to Jackie for the amazing job that she did.

Pat adjourned the meeting at approximately 12:30 pm.


Barbara currently gives lectures, trunk shows and teaches nationally and internationally. She loves to design and piece guilts from her home in Shenandoah Valley, Virginia.


