President's Corner



Being a quilter, and a lover of all things color (hello Kaffe!), I am always interested to find out what the Pantone color of the year is. This year the color is "Mocha Mousse." In other words, brown. I am not, and never have never been, a fan of brown. I grew up in the 70's, so brown was definitely a thing along with avocado green, harvest gold and a burnt orange. No thanks to all of those! It's true that 2025's Mocha Mousse, described as "a medium-shade brown that's both modern and sophisticated," is a much nicer color than anything the 1970's had to offer. And it's apparently a good neutral compliment to dusty blues, muted teals, deep greens, creams and soft pinks. But still "meh" for me.

Feeling disappointed by the Pantone color, I looked to see if there was an alternative, specifically for fabric, and found Robert Kaufman's choice for 2025, Kona Cotton's "Nocturne." Since the word nocturne means "night" (specifically, "inspired by or evocative of the night"), I expected a deep midnight blue. But Kona's nocturne is a regal shade of purple, a very saturated color one might describe as "grape." A color that Kaffe would use!

The choice of the colors we use in our quilts is as varied as our individual personalities. I don't know who chose these particular 2025 colors, or even if they matter. But it will be interesting to see if they start to show up in fabric lines, quilt designs and maybe even in our Outreach quilts and our monthly Show & Tells. Thankfully every color in the rainbow, and hundreds of variations on each, is available to us as quilters. And no matter what colors we choose to use, our quilts are made from our hearts and our hands, and, thus, always beautiful.

As always, keep quilting!

Minutes of the Bayside Board Meeting

January 24, 2025

A board Meeting of the Bayside Quilters of the Eastern Shore was held on January 24, 2025, at the Cooke's Hope Community Center. A quorum was present with all board positions represented and a total of 10 members of the guild in attendance. The meeting was called to order by President Jackie Granger at 11:10 a.m.

Operating Procedures: The board discussed proposed edits to the "Committees" section of the Operating Procedures. Discussed for deletion from the list were Hospitality, Library, and the Past President advisory role. It was recommended to remove Hospitality as a committee since we no longer offer refreshments at meetings, and instead have members volunteer to organize our two social events each year - our anniversary luncheon and our holiday party. It was also recommended to remove Library as a committee since Bayside no longer maintains a library of quilt books. The Past President role was created as an advisory position, but most past presidents choose to participate informally, so the role as a specific position is no longer relevant and a proposal was made to remove it from the official list. A proposal was made to add the following to the Committees section: Audio/Visual, Fundraising, Table Chair, and New Members. All agreed to these changes with an unanimous vote.

By-Laws: No changes to the guild's by-Laws were proposed, but Sharon Miller will review the by-laws for outdated policies such as the requirements to send notices by postage instead of email.

Roles & Responsibilities: Each board member and advisory committee chair was asked to complete a roles & responsibilities document for their position. These have been 90% completed and are available on the Bayside website under the Members Only tab.

Sunshine Committee Budget: The board unanimously approved a \$300 budget for the Sunshine Chair to use for cards and postage as well as illness or bereavement gifts. This year get well flowers were sent to a member and five trees were planted in honor of Eunice Knauer using the President's discretionary fund.

4-H: Lou Diefenderfer reported that 25 4-H members signed up for the January/February 2025 sewing classes which are now open to Talbot, Dorchester and Caroline County 4-H members. Lou Proposed a \$1,000 4-H budget for next year. This will include include \$300 sponsorships for each of the Talbot County and Dorchester/Caroline County Fairs, as well as funds to cover the cost of materials for the classes. Thanks to Eunice's fabric sale, 4-H will receive an extra \$260 this year (as will Outreach). Lou suggested purchasing one sewing machine annually for a 4-H member. Jo Verne offered to donate a few machines, and it was suggested that each year we ask the Bayside membership if anyone has a functioning machine that they would be willing to donate to a 4-H kid. The board unanimously approved the \$1,000 budget for 4-H, to be effective for the 2025-2026 fiscal year. Marianne Hamilton suggested encouraging members to donate materials for next year's 4-H classes, and having a raffle prize for anyone who donates Lou mentioned that she would love to have the 4-H members showcase their class projects during a Bayside meeting Show & Tell. It was agreed that this will be scheduled during the August Meeting, as the September luncheon conflicts with the school year.

Outreach: Pat Massimini and Jan Bohn are working on building a points-of-contact list for where we donate items, as well as recruiting Bayside members to support specific outreach efforts. They will ask members for suggestions on groups to support and personal contacts they may have. Most members seem to like making outreach items that are targeted to

individuals or a community and would also like to make smaller items. Jo Verne suggested potholders for Habitat for Humanity Welcome Baskets and other smaller items that everyone can make. Karli Abbott offered to create a half-sheet with outreach project ideas to include in the new member bags as well as to put on the outreach table. It was suggested that Outreach should highlight one organization each month at the guild meeting, explaining what the organization does, how we can help the organization, what items we currently donate, etc. as well as show some of the items during the guild meeting. The board also discussed and agreed to change the monthly prizes drawing from a name tag drawing to an Outreach drawing. Anyone who brings in an item (quilt, quilt top, mammo pillow, etc.) for Outreach will get a raffle ticket and will be in the drawing for the wonderful fabric gifts that JafTex and Katie Wyatt donate.

Minutes of the Bayside Board Meeting Continued

Programs: Marianne Hamilton and Sharon Miller reported that upcoming guild lectures have been opened to outside guilds, with non-members paying \$10 at the door and receiving a program schedule for the year. Workshops will open to outside guilds at the start of each month for a slightly higher fee. The programs committee also secured a 15% corporate discount with the Tidewater Inn for guest lecturers.

Budget: Committee chairs were reminded to monitor their budgets and notify the board if they anticipate overspending. A suggestion for tracking donations was requested so that when the new board is inducted next year, they will have an idea of how to plan their budget.

Storage: The Bayside storage unit cost has increased to \$80 per month. Jackie Granger confirmed that we do not use several of the larger items in the unit, and that they can be trashed, donated or sold, reducing the amount of space we need. Karli Abbott offered to scan and upload the guild's historical files to a Google Drive, further reducing the storage space needed. Lou Diefenderfer offered to request a small storage space for Bayside at the Trappe Volunteer Fire Company at a cost of \$50 per month. Lou will discuss this with the TVFC board at their February 11 meeting.

New Members: Karli is planning a quarterly New Member Meeting, which will take place after the regular guild meeting and include snacks and an overview of Bayside offerings. The board discussed creating name tag kits for new members. Jo Verne suggested that the New Member job be turned into a Committee and split into two groups: one for welcoming/onboarding and another for recruitment. This idea has been tabled to talk about at a later date.

New Board Nominations: Lisa Schober will remain as treasurer for another year as the treasurer term is two years. Jan Bohn and Pat Massimini will stay as Outreach co-chairs. Jo Verne will continue in her board role of Education & preservation. Jackie Granger will be stepping down as president after serving for two terms. Lou Diefenderfer, currently the vice president expressed a willingness in serving as president, and Karli Abbott expressed interest in serving as vice president. We will need to fill the secretary role and add a member to the programs team so that Marianne Hamilton and Sharon Miller can transition the responsibility.

Other New Business:

The board approved a \$500 donation to the Trappe Volunteer Fire Company to thank them again for their support of our Handmade Market fundraiser.

Kin West has volunteered to be the chairperson for a on-day Spring Quilt Show which will be held at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Easton. The church will provide the space free of charge. A proposal and date will be presented to the board within the next few weeks.

The board discussed ways to improve our monthly Show & Tell due to concerns about lengthy presentations and a general lack of participation from members. Lou Diefenderfer offered to take charge of revitalizing Show & Tell starting with our March meeting. Suggestions

included setting up a display table for items after they are shown and offering prizes for participation. Jo Verne offered to donate gift cards, and Lou happily accepted.

The board reaffirmed that members can have links to classes or services they provide posted on our Bayside Quilters website free of charge Non-members are required to pay a fee. All must be sewing/quilting related.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:37 p.m.

THREADS - What's the BIG deal?



This is a FUN lecture on all the things you didn't know you needed to know about thread! As an educator for WonderFil Specialty Threads, Nina has learned a lot and she wants to share!

Thread is like candy! Sometimes you just can't get enough...LOL! When we purchase thread it's usually the color we buy, or the thread the shop carries. In this lecture you'll learn about the different weights of thread and why they make a difference. Ply, why is that important? Specialty threads like metallic, monofilament, tinsel threads, how do we work with them? Why do metallics give us issues? This lecture is FULL of information you'll be thrilled you know now!

English Paper Piecing (EPP) (Required kit at \$30)



English paper piecing is fun, creative, imaginative, and addicting! EPP can be a lot of different things...simple, complex, simple fabrics, fussy cut designs, small project, large bed quilt, small pieces, large pieces...absolutely anything you want it to be!

Traditionally, EPP is a hand sewing activity. This is a project that can travel with you to keep hands busy

while in a car, on a plane, in the airport, in a hotel, on a train! It's small, portable, packable, and fun!

In class we learn:

- how to hand sew a Hexagon flower. There are tips and tricks you learn along the way to make things simpler for you.
- We talk about fussy cutting...OH MY, the fun in fussy cutting!!! This is where it gets REALLY fun!!! You will look at fabrics very differently once you start fussy cutting for EPP!
- Other project possibilities.
- EPP can also be achieved on a sewing machine! (This makes it less portable.). I show you how to do this on your sewing machine.

EPP has brought me much joy and allowed me to be creative in fabrics and designing. I hope to share this same joy with you and your group!

She loves kaleidoscopes!!! So be sure to sign up for Thursday's workshop to see how easy they are to make.

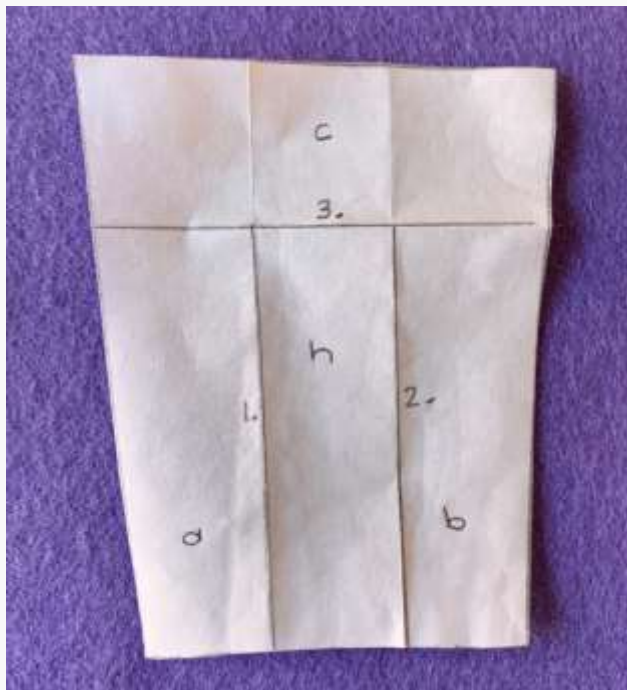

Freezer Paper Piecing

You'll learn two freezer paper techniques in this workshop. The first (below) is how to use freezer paper to do traditional foundation paper piecing without having to tear the paper off at the end. Simply press, fold and sew (off the paper).

The second technique (right), based on a Ricky Tims method, will show you how to transform commercial designs or your own free form designs into freezer paper templates which will then be transferred to fabric and stitched. If you've ever wanted to do curved piecing, you'll love this technique, because it makes it possible to do all kinds of interesting designs, but be warned, it does take some patience, precision, and practice.

To fit Scott’s schedule this will be a zoom Meeting (our one and only for the year)..

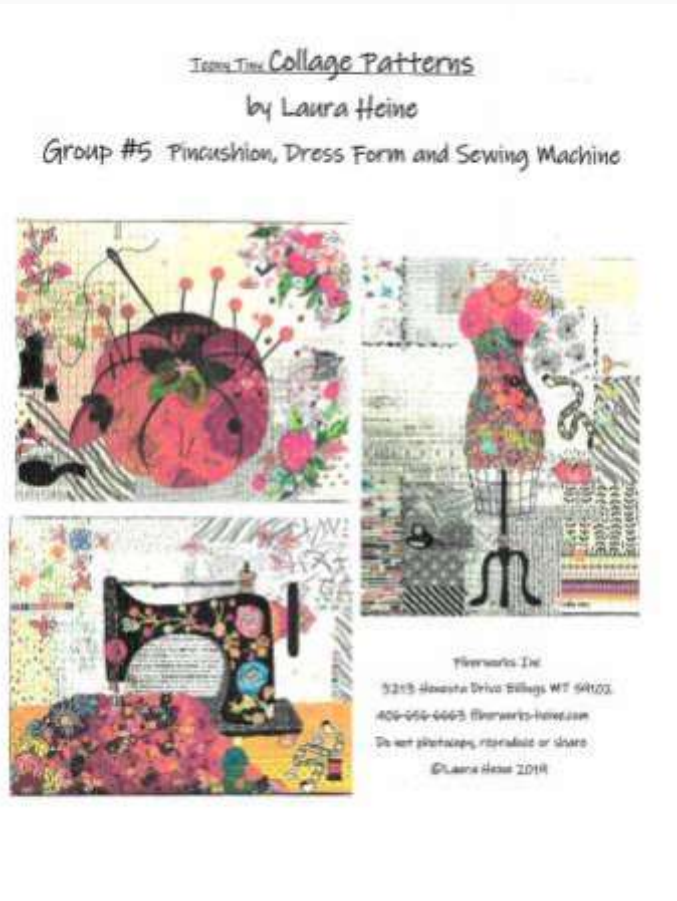
Afternoon Open Sew

In this class, we will learn how to make one of the Laura Heine Collage Quilts. We will be using Laura Heine's Pincushion pattern, and everyone will be working to create their own style. Or if you have completed Laura Heine's Teeny Tiny pincushion, you are welcome to use another teeny tiny pattern. I would avoid the Teeny Tiny patterns that use the small strips (Ex: Abilene the cow). That is a different technique we will not be covering. You will learn why we use Steam-A-Seam 2 for applique pieces. Master the cutting and trimming of applique pieces. We will be working on the collage part of the pattern, but I will give ideas for finishing your project.
