The meeting was called to order at 9:00am by President Sharon Miller.

Jo Verne suggested we think about a B list of meeting places for when the &*#\$% virus is done in case the Easton Fire House is no longer a viable meeting place. The discussion resulted in a decision to make a list of potential places with relevant information on each (do we have to set up and tear down ourselves, do we get storage, etc.). Sharon will see if a list from Anita's search last year is in the President's book and Jo will try to recreate the one she did when we moved to EVFD.

FINANCIALS: the 2020-2021 budget was approved unanimously.

It was decided to have a January Zoom meeting on January 13, 2021, at our regular meeting time. Show and Tell – we'll ask people to send a picture to someone to be determined who will screen share while the maker talks about it. We hope to have a Bayside member give a talk and perhaps a demo/tutorial as well.

February Sew-In will also be a Zoom meeting. A welcome at 10am. Participants can stay online and chat while sewing and/or come back online about noon to have lunch and show & tell. Chris could send out project directions – mammo pillows, pillowcases, 4-hour quilts, potholders for peace etc: quilters would supply their own materials and then bring finished projects to Chris or collection points. Jo said she'd provide fabric (already cut) and patterns and mail them to quilters for a raffle quilt if that was of interest.

Anita's survey had a few people who were interested in a quilt camp. She will put them in contact with each other.

The International Quilt Museum in Nebraska is opening up online and we're getting information to access their exhibits, webinars etc. More to follow.

Waterfowl Festival. Eunice Knauer and Karli Abbott exhibited waterfowl quilts. Do we want to make waterfowl themed things to exhibit and sell as a fundraiser? Questions to be answered – how much does a booth cost? Could we get enough volunteers to staff a booth? Could we get enough donations to have enough to sell? Could be consignments?

The meeting was adjourned at 10:30am.

Zoom into 2021 9:00 AM on January 13 Tips for Using It from a Mac User

Our January 13, 2021 meeting will be held using the Zoom app. Start by downloading the app, zoom.us. On an Apple device it can be found in the Apple/App store. Androids, PCs have something similar. You will receive an email a few days before our meetings with a link. Click on the link and follow the prompts. You will want to sign-on using video and audio. You'll be in a "waiting room" until given access. Please acquaint yourself with the functions within the app such as Mute, Raise hand, Chat, Speaker/Shared screen toggle.

The Zoom room will open at 8:45-9:00 AM. The regular meeting will start at 9:30. All attendees will be muted. This helps everyone to hear what's being said by the speaker. When it's your turn to speak during announcements or show and tell you need to Unmute yourself. Don't forget to Mute when you're done. If you have a question or comment use the Raise Your Hand. It's a much better experience if one person at a time is unmuted. If you have problems call me at 410-725-4323 and I'll try to help.

February 10, 2021 Annual Outreach Sew-In, Nope! Reach Out Day, Yup! (No sewing)

Obviously, we aren't going to be in a big room with lunch provided this year. Donations to all charitable entities drop off after the holidays. Baysiders have always been generous. Outreach gave quilts to Talbot Interfaith Shelter at Christmas but we didn't have an Angel tree or choose an organization to share our abundance with. Here's our chance to help those in need. I'm hoping to have a Zoom meeting with a program from a Bayside member. To be announced.

Reach Out Day Wednesday, February 10, 2021 1PM-4PM

The idea is to gather food for people and animals, gift cards or good old cash or checks and distribute it to the county where each of us reside. Make checks payable to Bayside Quilters designating that it is for Reach-Out Day. There are several food bank and animal shelters. We have members in Queen Anne, Caroline, Dorchester, Wicomico and Talbot counties. Members from Delaware, Maryland western shore and out-of state members are encouraged to participate in any way they can.

How? I am asking for a person in each county to serve as the Collection agent. If I don't have a volunteer by January 18 I'll be calling you. <u>If there is no Collector in a county there will be no donation to that county.</u> The Collector will be responsible for gathering and delivery of food to their county food bank or animal shelter in Bayside Quilters name. (Ask a friend for help.) The Donation Destination can be public or your own home. The Collector will choose the designated recipient(s). The donations can be contactless and you might get to see some people you may not have seen for a while. Chatting is optional.

For example, I live in Talbot County. In my garage I would set up box(es) to put food in and one for non-food items. I would then deliver food to local food banks and/or animal shelters. Cash and checks would be given to the Bayside Treasurer. She would send a check from Bayside to the designated recipient.

An invitation to participate will also be sent to Heartland, Queen Anne quilt guilds. Ocean Waves (Delaware) may be included. If you know of any other quilt group let me know.

Suggestions for food donations from the Maryland Food Bank are:

- Two for Two: Bring two cans of food and \$2.00
- Supper Sides: Rice, mashed potatoes, pasta, yams, collard greens, beans, spinach
- Fish Friday: Tuna, sardines, salmon
- Peanut Butter & Jelly Day: Low-sugar jelly, low-sodium peanut butter
- Fruit &Veggie Mania: Pears, peaches, apple sauce, pineapple, mandarin oranges, fruit cocktail, corn, peas, carrots
- Dinner is Served: Tuna Helper, stew, chili, pasta, soup
- Spaghetti Week: Pasta, sauces, mushrooms, tomatoes
- Heart Healthy Week: Foods that are low-sodium, low-fat, contain whole grains, fruits that are packed in juice.

What about the quilts!!!!! If you have an Outreach quilt, completed or not, you can drop it off at the same time. Quilts can be made from fabric in your own stash. Chris Dorset will try to have some ready-to-sew quilt kits to take home with you.

Shimmering Triangles – Jan 16, 2021, 10-4 EST via video conference in the safety of your own home.



Make this gorgeous quilt that gives the effect of water rippling in a stream. It is a perfect pattern to showcase beautiful fabric, especially large scale prints.

You will achieve the shimmer by applying easy to understand color and value concepts that you can also use to enhance all your future quilts!

This quilt looks complicated, but is actually quite easy to construct. You will learn a quick piecing method for half-square triangles with perfect points.

By the end of class, you should have a design layout for your fabrics, completed several blocks, and understand how to complete your quilt on your own.

Pattern, designed by Jenny Bowker, is required (\$15). Instructions on how to order is included on the registration page. Size options include small, sofa throw and bed.

Class fee includes individual feedback regarding fabric choices and layout before class via email. Of course, students can also get feedback during class.

Amazing Abstracts - Live Online 1 Day Version – Jan 30 and Feb 6, 2021 (attend both sessions), 1 - 4 p.m. EST via video conference in the safety of your own home



Create an abstract quilt that has amazing movement and drama. Go from inspiration to a simple sketch, then have fun "coloring" your sketch with bits of fabric to create a mock-up of your design – see before you sew! The design is gridded and blocks are foundation pieced using an easy sew and flip method with room for creativity and improvisation. Lots of discussion of how to use color and value to create the drama and desired effects. Based on the techniques of Ursula Kern (with her permission of course!).

This class is conducted in two sessions and the price includes both sessions. The first session covers design and creating the mockup. The 2nd session covers construction. Students can start with a base pattern of a star burst and add their own coloration and value choices, or they can come up with their own original design.

Create your sparkling 17" gem using freezer paper templates – NOT paper piecing. This is a fun and forgiving technique. Your quilt will shine with brilliance and look complex; only you will know how easy it is to achieve. Free setting patterns available.

This virtual class features a mix of my instruction, slides, and professional video of the designer, MJ Kinman, explaining each of the construction techniques. Because of the interactive video and audio capabilities, I can review the work of each participant and provide helpful hints and feedback. 
