Minutes of the Regular Meeting of Bayside Quilters June 14, 2023

The meeting at the Trappe Volunteer Fire Company hall was called to order by President Pat Massimini at 9:30 am.

Announcements: Pat reminded members to check out the updated Bayside website and mentioned that we have received several inquiries from potential new members through the site.

Pat thanked Lisa Schober for donating the purchase of an Owl so that we can effectively ZOOM Bayside meetings. Pat reminded members in the room to avoid side conversations as the Owl is very sensitive to sound. She also asked ZOOM participants to ensure the they are on "mute" throughout the meeting.

Lisa Schober offered to assist any "newbies" going to the Houston Quilt Show this year. Feel free to contact Lisa if you want tips for getting to and negotiating the show.

Nita Brayton spoke about Talbot Interfaith Shelter (TIS), a non-profit that we currently support with quilts, and have supported in the past with their Angel Tree Christmas initiative. Nita described the incredible work TIS does to guide families (approximately 60 currently) from homelessness to independence, including the role of volunteers who help provide supervision, meals and fellowship. Nita asked for volunteers to join her team which covers the 31st of each month (7 months of the year) in shifts: 8-11am, 11-2pm & 2-4pm. Nita has lost a few Bayside volunteers who have moved out of the area, and needs to rebuild her team. Treasurer's Report: Lisa Schober gave the treasurer's report and confirmed that due to the success of our handmade sale in November, the guild is holding its own financially.

Following Show & Tell, Pat introduced our speaker, T. Carter. T's Program, quilts inspired by Native American cultures, included a trunk show with accompanying stories of each quilt, some history of the Lakota and Dakota Indian tribes and a Q&A.

Lecture Anatomy of an Improv Quilt

Cindy Grisdela – Artist, Teacher & Author (cindygrisdela.com)

Have you ever wondered how to create an Improv Quilt without a pattern? Where do you start? How do you know when it's finished? Author and award winning artist Cindy Grisdela will share her tips and tricks in this entertaining lecture about the process for working improvisationally from start to finish.

Workshop Fabulous Freehand Curves

July 13, 2023, 9am - 4pm, Trappe Fire Department



In this workshop you will cut large scale curves freehand without templates or patterns. Add dots, skinny lines, wonky triangles and more to give each curve its own personality, then combine them into a fun original design.

We'll talk about color and design to create the composition as well as the techniques needed.

Basic sewing skills and a sewing machine in good working order are necessary.

Best for students with some experience with curves—not for beginners. Limit 24. We'll open to other guilds on June 28, if Bayside doesn't fill class.

Cindy's Teaching Philosophy

I believe that each one of us has the ability to be creative—we just need to allow our creativity space to grow. Improv is a great way to give yourself permission to play with no rules and no patterns. I encourage my students to explore their own ideas using my techniques as inspiration to design their own original art quilts. We talk about color, about simple design principles to keep in mind as you create, explore improvisational techniques that I use in my work, and discuss ideas for quilting and finishing. I enjoy teaching and my classes can be successfully adapted to different skill levels.

Fabulous Freehand Curves Supply List



Cut large scale curves freehand without templates or patterns. Add dots, skinny lines, wonky triangles and more to give each curve its own personality, then combine them into a fun original design.

We'll talk about color and design to create the composition as well as the techniques needed.

Best for students with some experience with curves—not for beginners.

8-12 fat quarters (18"x 22") or equivalent in a variety of values—lights, mediums and darks

Sewing machine in good working order with a 1/4" foot

Rotary cutter and mat – I like the 60mm rotary cutter, but bring whatever size you like best, with a new blade

Rulers—suggest 15" square and 6" x 12"

Basic quilting supplies including straight pins, seam ripper, neutral thread,

scissors and/or snips for cutting threads, measuring tape, safety pins

Batting or flannel to use as a "design wall"

Notebook and pen or pencil to take notes

Digital camera or phone to take photos of design options (optional)


