**Lecture: Cheryl See presents “Anatomy of a Quilt”
(Specializing in Handwork)**



This lecture provides an entertaining comparison of anatomy and quilts. I hope to make you laugh, inspire you, and teach a little along the way.

Selvages & Embellishment Half Day Workshop (\$40)

**Take your quilt to the next level with hand embroidery
and embellishment**

In this Half-Day workshop students will have made a block using selvages sewn by machine on a muslin backing. Lace, rick rack, and or ribbon will be sewn on in class. Hand embroidery stitches will be taught and used to embellish this selvage block. Students are invited to bring other embellishment options (buttons, beads, etc.) if they wish to discuss placement to personalize their project when they get home.

***Prep before class:**

- Choose fabric for cutting your selvages or use from your stash. Choose an assortment of colors or one or two favorite colors
- Cut strips of selvages of varying widths of fabric showing (3/4" to 2")
- Lay selvages in rows or on diagonal overlaying finished edge over raw edges of strips. Sew together strips of selvages by machine onto a muslin backing to form an 8" to 12" block

***Alternate Prep for those who do not want to use selvages or
are in a time crunch**

- Substitute the selvage block with a striped fabric of your choice. I would suggest one with varying widths of stripes for variety.
- Students who have not done prep for class are still welcome. They just may not have the block done in time to embellish block with trim or practice embroidery stitches.

Lecture: Kestrel Michaud
Presenting
Kestrel's Creations (a trunk show)

If you have never seen Kestrel's art quilts, you are in for a real treat. She labels herself as a classically-trained, imaginative realism fine artist with a passion for illustrating in fabric.

Her art quilts are made with intricate fabric piecing which assembles into a quilt that looks like a beautiful painting. Her work has won more than 50 local, regional, national and international awards.

Here are a few of her more recent creations.



UFO's???

Or what the heck to do with them!!!

Too hot to do much more than sew, so I keep cleaning out my sewing room when I'm between projects. I found a 16 qt. tote full of some beautiful fabric called Chelsea Lane by Pat Sloan for P&B Textiles, all washed, ironed, folded, patted and put away. I was a new quilter in 2005, hadn't retired yet. I enjoyed learning new techniques. So I found this book, called Sew a Row. Interesting book that has many different blocks and different techniques. Of course I bought the ENTIRE line of fabric. Many, many fat quarters and much yardage (the tote is full). I made a bunch of blocks with nothing specific in mind to do with them.



And then I joined Bayside and retired. WOW, opened my eyes to a whole new, exciting world. Many classes (the first was Circles with Candy). I learned a lot from the classes and joined a couple of bees and continued to learn and grow my quilting skills. Yahoo! Off and having a great time. Meanwhile, there's this tote with everything for a Row by Row quilt (many quilts), in my closet. Well, with so many new projects to do, this tote got deeper and deeper into my closet. Life comes and it goes, you grow as quilter with each new project and technique. Tastes change. I went from Pastels, to 30's/40's, to Kaffe, to Civil War, to Brights, to Scrappy... now anything goes.

Back to this poor, lonely tote. I pulled it out of my closet about 6 months ago. I put the blocks up on the design wall and then, put them back into the tote. I just could not come up with a plan. Yesterday, going thru my mind on what I was going to use to make mammo pillows for Outreach this month. I pulled those blocks out; most of them were 8 1/2" (perfect), lots of washed fabric. And as Paul Harvey used to say, "Now for the rest of the story... 10 Mammo pillows, ready to be stuffed and delivered to the Clarke Breast Center.



So if you have extra blocks and don't know what to do with them, make them about 6" - 8". Square or rectangle. You can stuff and close them or Outreach has stuffing, we can stuff, label and close them. Or bring your pillows to Outreach meetings and finish them there. There are usually a good number of gals there, so a lot of talking, show and tells and just a little bit of bragging!

Outreach meetings are the 4th Wednesday each month at the Immanuel Lutheran Church. Then when we have a bag full of finished pillows, we will deliver them to the Clarke Breast Center. They need about 300 a year.

I'm going closet diving again and hope to find more blocks to finish into mammo pillows. I also gained a tote full of beautiful fabric to use in many Outreach quilts! So make Outreach some mammo pillows from your UFO's! And as Alice told me, many years ago... Use it up!

There are two calls.

The first is for a short turn around, deadline July 26, 2024. This is for artists residing in the USA and Canada. The themes were chosen to work well for finding available work. The entry form is open now.

Short Term Themes:

"Gardens of Gratitude: Blooming with Hope" is a vibrant art quilt exhibition designed to transform the hospital environment into a vibrant, supportive, and healing space. Centered around the theme of gardens and growth, symbolizing healing, resilience, and the beauty of life, this exhibition creates an uplifting and inspiring atmosphere. "Gardens of Gratitude" aims to foster a sense of gratitude, positivity, and connection among patients, visitors, and staff, while uplifting spirits and instilling hope.

"Colors of Hope: An Artistic Journey of Positivity" is a vibrant art quilt exhibition designed to transform the hospital environment into a vibrant and joyful space. Leveraging the power of color and light, this exhibition uplifts the spirits of hospital patients, visitors, and staff.
