Minutes of Bayside Quilters Board Meeting

February 9, 2022

A meeting of the Board of Bayside Quilters, held at Trappe Volunteer Fire Dept. fire hall, was called to order by Sharon Miller, President, following the regular meeting of the guild, a quorum of voting members being present.

The first topic for discussion concerned whether or not there was a need to look at the budget mid-term and adjust. Lisa Schober, treasurer, advised that this was not a standard procedure and is unnecessary. She reported that we are 'doing o.k.'

The cost of workshops was discussed. Currently it is \$40 for all workshops despite the charge of the presenter. The possibility of increasing the fee or subsidizing more was talked about. A decision was made to keep the fee at \$40 right now and defer further discussion until July or August. There have been very few workshops during covid so we need to reassess when meetings follow a more normal pattern of lecture followed by a workshop.

A need to review the speaker contract now that some are coming via Zoom was deferred until the next board meeting. Debbie Brobst, program chairman, said that each contract seems to be a little different and standardization would be helpful.

The ByLaws also need revisiting but the Board decided to defer that matter also. Sharon asked everyone to get a copy, read and suggest changes.

Sharon asked for volunteers for the Nominating Committee. As none were forthcoming, she suggested asking Sherry Burke to do it again. She will contact Sherry.

Having a fundraiser of Quilt Bingo was discussed. No decisions were made at this time.

Meeting was adjourned at 12 noon.

Thirty!!! Year Challenge



Can you believe it? Bayside Quilters has been active, even during a world wide pandemic, for *thirty* years and it's time for a quilt challenge to mark the anniversary.

SIZE: The challenge quilt size can be as small as 12" on one side to throw/lap (50" x 65"). The quilt won't be disqualified if your entry is smaller or larger. Quilts will be divided into size groups at the reveal finale. Size is NOT a factor in judging.

DESIGN: The pattern, design, style, color is the makers choice. You get to decide what to make but it must be a quilt; 3 layers of materials sewn together. It must be finished. No dolls, stuffed animals, quilted books, bags/

purse-you get the idea.

DEADLINE: Delivered to Challenge Committee no later than the day before the anticipated Thirty-year celebration in August, 2022. Quilts will be displayed and judged at that time.

JUDGING: Viewers Choice.

To inspire your creativity you may want to start with some 30 year anniversary symbols. Traditional gem is pearl, modern is diamond. Color is green, flower is lily or sweet pea.



More than 300 quilts displayed include traditional, modern, and art quilts of all sizes and a wide range of quilting techniques. In addition, there will be daily quilting technique demonstrations, quilting vendors, a \$10-and-under boutique, a silent auction, peddler's table, raffle baskets and quilt art presentations.

The show also features the guild's award-winning raffle quilt, *Starlit Garden*, which placed second at the 2021 Maryland State Fair. The drawing for the raffle quilt will be held on May 21, 2022. Winner need not be present to win.




