## President's Corner



With this month being National Quilting Month, I thought it would be an ideal time to remind ourselves of our guild's charter, and to take a look at how we're doing at fulfilling it. As described in our Operating Procedures document, our guild's objectives reads as follows:

"Bayside Quilters of the Eastern Shore was established in 1992, and incorporated as a 501(c)(3) corporation in 2010. Its goals are to bring together people interested in quilts and in supporting and encouraging the present day art of quilt making; to contribute to the community by supporting charitable and educational quilt making activities, and to establish lines of communication among members for the stimulation of thought, exchange of ideas, mutual assistance, education about quilt making and enhancement of individual strengths."

Each month our Bayside meeting is aimed at fulfilling our goals of bringing together those of us who are interested in quilts and providing the opportunity to foster communication and exchange ideas. In offering lectures, presentations, trunk shows, workshops and demonstrations, we create opportunities to educate and enhance individual strengths.

Looking outward to our community objectives, at the February meeting we discussed the successful sewing/quilting classes that were held in January and February for local 4-H members. Teaching sewing and quilting to our area youth is our way of supporting the continuation of quilt making here on the Eastern Shore. This month, and in April, our focus will be on outreach - our commitment to contribute to our community by supporting charitable activities. Outreach is considered by many to be one of our most important objectives. The donations of quilts and other items are our guild's way of providing comfort and support to those around us. While Outreach is identified as a Bee, it is an objective in our charter, and thus something that each and every one of us should contribute to if at all possible. Jan Bohn and Pat Massimini are making it as easy as possible for each of us to our part. At our upcoming meeting they will have a myriad of kits to take home: kits for piecing quilt tops, kits for quilting completed quilt tops (we need more longarmers to help!), kits for hand binding completed quilts, kits for mammo pillows and kits for burp cloths. They will also accept items that you have completed on your own, and as a last, but also very welcome resort, they will accept a monetary donation (because batting is expensive!). Please do whatever you can to help.

Looking at all that our guild does is impressive. If I were grading our efforts at meeting our goals, I would easily give us an A-. We are doing a great job, but of course there is always a bit of room for improvement!

Thank you to each of you for all you do to make our guild the success that it is.

# Bayside Quilters Meeting Minutes

## February 12, 2025

The meeting was called to order by president Jackie Granger. Due to the inclement weather, the meeting was delayed from 9:30 to 11:00am. Jackie welcomed members both at the Trappe firehouse and on Zoom, and thanked everyone for their flexibility. There were no new members or guests.

Since our January meeting was cancelled, there were no minutes to accept.

Jackie presented a few new business items, some from the recent Bayside board meeting:

1. We received a very nice thank you note from Jean, Shirley, Patti & Lou for the trees that we had planted in Eunice's name.
2. Because of another successful Handmade Market, we have again donated \$500 to the Trappe Volunteer Fire Company to thank them for their continued generosity & support of our guild.
3. What has been, for a long time, our name tag raffle will now be a raffle to support Outreach. Starting next month, anyone bringing in a completed item for Outreach will be eligible to win one of the wonderful panels and/or fabric collections that Jaftex and Katie Wyatt donate to us each month. Special thanks to both Lou & Jo Verne who again coordinated the classes, and to Sharon Miller & Julia Cohoon who each created, put together kits for & taught one of the classes.

Last, and most important, we will need to fill some board & advisory positions for the upcoming 2025/2026 fiscal year that starts in September. The Roles & Responsibilities for all but a few of Bayside's positions are now on our website in the Members Only section. # An Invitation from Talbot County Free Library

Talbot County Free Library (TCFL) is celebrating 100 years of lending & learning this year! To commemorate this milestone anniversary, TCFL has invited us to display our quilts right where all the activity happens, in their large main library room. This is a fantastic place to display quilts. The room has high exposed metal beams and also some wall space. We need only to supply the quilts. Talbot County maintenance people will install them. The library has a supply of rods and magnets to suspend quilts so no sleeves are required. Quilts can be hung from the rafters back to back, so we will need between 20 to 42 quilts.

The target date for installation is June 1. Scotti Oliver, TCFL Assistant Director, is asking to display them for 3-6 months (the longer the better). My goal as facilitator is to get a good mix of traditional, contemporary, modern, wool/flannel and art quilts. To avoid quilts being touched, the length should not be more than 72”.

If you are interested in having one of your quilts hung in the library, you will need to fill out a form with information about your quilt as well as provide a mandatory photo of it. These forms will be



available at the next few Bayside meetings. If you need a photo taken, please bring your quilt to a meeting. **NO QUILT WILL BE ENTERED WITHOUT A PHOTO.**

The library has liability insurance and will supply certification of this to us.

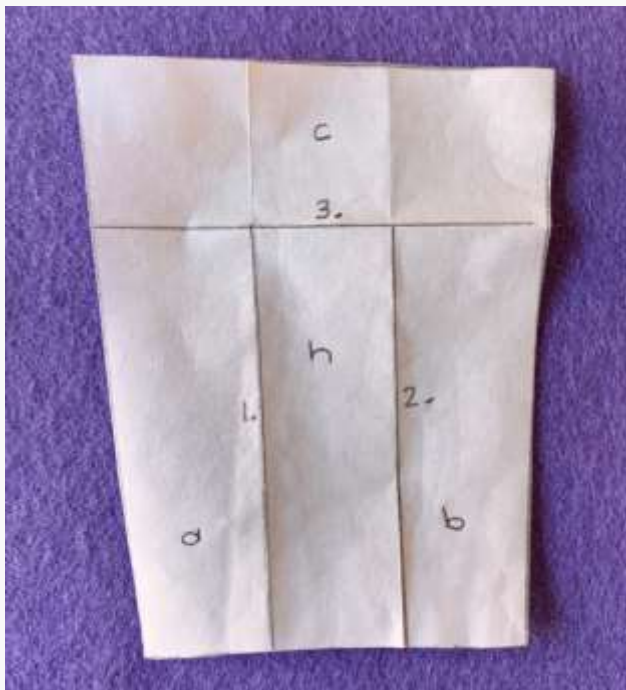

## **Freezer Paper Piecing**

You'll learn two freezer paper techniques in this workshop. The first (below) is how to use freezer paper to do traditional foundation paper piecing without having to tear the paper off at the end. Simply press, fold and sew (off the paper).

The second technique (right), based on a Ricky Tims method, will show you how to transform commercial designs or your own free form designs into freezer paper templates which will then be transferred to fabric and stitched. If you've ever wanted to do curved piecing, you'll love this technique, because it makes it possible to do all kinds of interesting designs, but be warned, it does take some patience, precision, and practice.

**Laura Heine Collage  
Workshop**  
**Presented by**  
**Cathy Thornton from Crabby  
Quilter**

**Pattern Required  
(Available from Cathy)**

**Kit Optional \$35**

In this class, we will learn how to make one of the Laura Heine Collage Quilts. We will be using Laura Heine's Pincushion pattern, and everyone will be working to create their own style. Or if you have completed Laura Heine's Teeny Tiny pincushion, you are welcome to use another teeny tiny pattern. I would avoid the Teeny Tiny patterns that use the small strips (Ex: Abilene the cow). That is a different technique we will not be covering. You will learn why we use Steam-A-Seam 2 for applique pieces. Master the cutting and trimming of applique pieces. We will be working on the collage part of the pattern, but I will give ideas for finishing your project.



## **Collage: An assemblage ... of diverse elements or fragments in unlikely or unexpected juxtaposition. The Laura Heine Method**

I like to make collage pieces; therefore, I participated in a workshop at The Crabby Quilter in January. Cathy is a certified Laura Heine instructor and part owner of the store. Bayside Quilters has an opportunity to participate in the collage workshop in April. To participate you will need Laura's pattern (available from Cathy) which has three designs, a tomato pincushion, a sewing machine, and a dress form. Cathy allowed me to attempt the sewing machine. The others did the tomato. I should have done the tomato. We all left with a good basic knowledge of the Laura Heine method and a nearly completed project.



Cathy will have a kit available for \$35, otherwise the supply list can get a bit expensive, and no sewing machine required. The most expensive item is the Laura Heine pressing mat & Teflon pressing sheet. Unless you want to make multiple collages, bring a protective fabric or Teflon sheets to protect the iron board and iron. I recommend using the tomato pattern. You also need pattern ease to design and build the collage. Steam-a-Seam 2 is mandatory for superior results. A good, serrated scissors make cutting out the fused motifs possible. There is a lot to fuse; it takes a while to get good, fused pieces.

The Crabby Quilter classroom accommodates five students. (It is nice to have supplies or fabric readily available.) Trappe Volunteer Fire Company gives us ample space so all students can have their own ironing center. The five students shared two ironing stations which may have slowed us down a bit. There was nothing on the list that I did not use but, so far, not as much is required. I suggest you bring a broad selection of patterned fabric. The fun of making collages is to use unexpected motifs to create your personal work of art. Please search the internet for Laura Heine kits to get an idea of what you may want to use for the background.

Try it, you may unleash the artist in you.

Submitted by Nita Brayton and approved by another student, Lou Defenderfer. We will be taking the class again in April.

I'll show you my way of doing needle turn applique with freezer paper. You will have a choice of one or two blocks—A or B on the picture right. You can use this finished piece in many ways, a pillow, the center of a medallion wall hanging or table topper or simply framed.

I will give you a quick tutorial on making bias stems. I will have ready made stems for you to use in your block. You can opt to bring your own supplies (Supply List will be provided) or purchase a kit for \$15.
