Minutes of the Regular Meeting of Bayside Quilt Guild

September 14, 2022

President, Pat Massimini, called the meeting of the Bayside Quilt Guild to order. The meeting was held at the Trappe Fire Department and by Zoom.

Pat thanked Candy for the day's program, "Hand Work" – to be given by Guild Members.

Pat explained the August meeting did not include a business meeting; the July Minutes had never been approved. Pat asked that the Minutes be approved and seconded.

Pat reminded everyone of the upcoming talk "Many Threads" to be given by our own Alice Kish at the Talbot County Free Library on September 17th at 2PM.

Pat explained the order of the guild meeting agenda will change for a few months. The new order will be a short business meeting, followed by Show & Tell, and then the Program.

The Business Meeting included reports from the following: Lisa Schober reported:

- We have 112 paid members
- Luncheon came in under budget
- Outreach came in under budget
- Purchases included a projector and screen

At present, calculations indicate that by year's end Guild will be in the red.

Pat asked for help with Zoom. As President, she is not able to set up and monitor Zoom when we have virtual speakers. Please contact Pat if you would be willing to help.

Candy Stiffler presented the Program schedule for the new year.

- October - Sallie Manke, "Be Inspired To Try Something New" a Zoom Trunk Show.
- November – Lyric Kinard will be presenting. This will also be a Zoom meeting.
- We will also have a class in November given by our own Marianne. Marianne will be teaching wool applique. There was a discussion on asking for a \$10 class fee to support this in-house class.
- Candy is still working on lining up speakers and programs for 2023.

Kay Butler reminded everyone of the Angel Wall Hanging Class to be given at FACES on 10/15 and 11/12. There is a \$35 fee for members and a \$45 fee for non-members.

Pat reminded all to save the date for the 30th Anniversary Public Sale – the Bayside Handmade Item Fundraiser. Members were encouraged to work on items. For details or to help, contact Jackie. The Attractions Magazine will be doing an article on our fundraiser.

Candy Stiffler announced the winner of the prize for the day. Kathy Taylor of Covenant Quilting donated a Halloween kit. Lisa Schober was the lucky winner.

Meeting was adjourned.

Minutes of the Bayside Quilt Guild Board Meeting

September 14, 2022

President, Pat Massimini, opened the meeting. There was a quorum,

Pat asked the Treasurer, Lisa Schober, to give a Treasurer's report, which included the following items:

- Bayside used to host 2 camps every year. We discussed the need to continue these camps. It was agreed the Trappe Firehouse sewing camps would be enough.
- Last year's budget for the Holiday Luncheon was \$500 for soups, decorations, and prizes. We agreed to keep the budget at \$500 this year. Next year the format will change so that we have soups & salads for the 2023 Summer Luncheon – Budget \$500. A more formal event for the 2023 Holiday luncheon.
- Do we need to renew our Zoom subscription. Pat noted we will need to renew; to have the option for virtual speakers and for our members who cannot attend meetings.
- The budget for Education is \$500.
- The yard sale fundraiser last year was a huge success, raising \$6,000.
- The budget for the Handmade Items Fundraiser in November is \$500, and the expected expense is also \$500. Trappe Firehouse is donating the space. Jackie Granger requested that we be able to accept credit cards. Lisa said card capability would be available but encouraged the use of cash; there is a fee for credit use.
- Lisa reminded everyone that the Guild has a Sales Tax Exemption Number. She will provide it to anyone who is making purchases on behalf of Bayside.
- Lisa is projecting a \$17,000 loss by end of year, based on a projected 95 paid members. This is a conservative estimate based on current and expected members.

Pat Massimini asked for the Budget to be approved. Jan Bohn made motion to approve, and Jo Verne seconded the motion. The budget was approved.

Other items: We discussed various ideas for raising funds, including:


- Selling raffle tickets for a free class.
- Allow non-members to attend virtual Programs for a fee, with speaker approval.
- Encourage members to make end-of-year tax deductible donations
- Raffle a quilt at the Talbot Humane Society Christmas shop
- Yard sale with 10% of the selling price to be donated to Bayside

We also discussed the need for a brainstorming session devoted to fundraising.


- We discussed hosting another quilt show. Large shows of the past are too difficult for the guild. Due to expenses, we may need to get donations or grants to fund it. It was suggested that we contact Paul Prager to request support. Pat will draft a letter.
- Candy Stiffler noted that it would be helpful to identify our next Program lead as soon as possible since there is such a long lead time on scheduling programs. We will ask for volunteers at the next Bayside meeting.
- Jan Bohn is having a luncheon at her house on 9/22/22 at 11:00 am to organize our Outreach activities. Jan is reaching out for help with Outreach Program.
- There is the need to refresh our Bylaws and Operating Procedures. Please send any comments or suggested revisions to Pat Massimini.

The next Board of Directors meeting will be held on December 6 at 2:00 pm at Lisa Schober's home.





Sally's mission is to delight others with textile art that exemplifies her passion for joyful, creative expression through color and texture.


She creates her art quilts and fiber art in her home studio in Arcadia, Michigan. Nature is a theme in her work.
