We donated 354 quilts, 18 pillowcases, 52 bibs, 1 receiving blanket, 24 hats, 264 pillows, 158 stuffed toys, 2 books, 4 kitchen towels, 90 children's scarves, 1 infant sweater set, 16 Easter Bunnies, 5 walker bags, 5 table toppers, 1 Singer serger, 1 quilt kit to a non-profit, 413 Christmas stockings and 15 afghans. Phew! Those items went to Caroline Family Service Center, Chapel District Elementary School PTO Grandmothers Club, Critchlow Adkins Children's Centers, Denton Elementary School, Dixon House, Talbot Co.
