Announcements: One guest, Rosemary Tapp, was introduced. She also became a new member before the meeting was over. Lou reminded attendees about Alice's Stash Reduction Sale. Next month is Red. Bring your red fabric donations and your cash.

Secretary's Report: The minutes were accepted as written.

Treasurer's Report: Kris Smith, Assistant Treasurer, provided an update of the guild's financial status. She says everything is good. She also let us know Maker's Day net profit is \$8,300.

Committee Reports:

Outreach – Pat Massimini, Outreach Assistant, thanked everyone for helping with our Outreach Goals. Members donated fabric, cut fabric, put kits together, pieced tops/pillows/banners/etc., longarmed all those beautiful tops, delivered the finished products to the final destinations and so much more. A special thank you went out to Kathy for the embroidered labels. January 28th is the next monthly sew in at the Emmanuel Lutheran Church, 10 a.m. – until. These quilts will be donated to the Hole in the Wall Gang Camp by the Paul Newman Foundation in Queenstown.

Programs – Sharon Miller, Programs Co-chair, announced the March presentation is by Cathy Thornton from Crabby Quilters. The morning portion is her Trunk Show. The afternoon class is the Laura Heine Technique. Cathy will also setup a popup shop.

Old Business: Nita has requested members make quilts to commensurate the 250th Birthday of the United States. There are some stipulations: colors - red, white, blue, beige and or gold, write a brief description of your quilt, it can't be any longer than 72 inches. Quilts will be displayed at the local library June thru August. You can opt to donate the quilt(s) to our Veteran Outreach. We need volunteers to help with 4-H Sewing Camp. 4-H'ers are coming from Talbot, Caroline and Dorchester Counties. First camp day is January 31st, Kin West is facilitating the project. The goal is to have the 4-H'er's make items they can enter in their county fair. The dates to volunteer are January 31st, February 21st and March 21st. Kris reminded everyone if they want to participate in the Ocean City Retreat to please see her.

New Business: Karli Abbott, Vice President, read a very sweet thank you note from Jo Verne. Lou reminded everyone about her new purple ticket challenge. July Jubilee Challenge



Modern Quilters,
Traditional Quilters,
Art Quilters,
Quilters of all
Passions!

*Think log cabin,
Think about a modern spin,
think about a traditional interpretation,
think about an art quilt.
Think about whatever spin you fancy!*

Coming soon...a July Jubilee...a celebrity speaker, a fabulous class and a fantastic log cabin challenge. More on the speaker and class later. For now, here's the scoop on the challenge.

Make a quilt (an unbound or unquilted top is OK) **no smaller** than 144" perimeter—e.g., 36" x 36" or 24" x 48". It can be as big as you like! It must be new for this challenge, and new can mean finally completed in 2026 so check those UFOs. The idea is to do something creative with the log cabin block. It can be a quilt with as few as one log cabin block; it can be modern or traditional; but, whatever it is the log cabin must be recognizable.



A challenge isn't a challenge without judging and prizes. We will have two winners—Judge's Choice and Viewer's Choice and two great prizes—a beautiful ribbon and a substantial gift certificate. The judging will be done at the July Meeting's Show and Tell and the prizes will be awarded at the August Luncheon.



But, there's more. Everyone must sign up by the March meeting, and everyone who signs up by March 11 **AND** presents their challenge at the July 8 meeting will get a swag bag full of goodies when they present their quilt in July.

So let's get busy and make some quilts that celebrate our July Jubilee and the ever popular log cabin block! And watch for the section "Challenge Chatter" over the next few months for more information on the log cabin quilt.

Challenge Chatter



In 1863, Log Cabin quilts became very popular to help raise funds for the Union Army during the American Civil War. It was thought to be in honor of Abraham Lincoln, who grew up in a log cabin. Quilts continued to become very popular as our nation was nearing the year of its centennial in 1876. The 100-year anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence seemed like the perfect time to look at how far the nation had come, from log-cabin living to a prosperous civilization.

“Fly Me to the Moon: An Art Quilt Journey”



I'm an art quilter whose work is highly textured and realistic. Providing the opportunity for other artists to shine through exhibits and publications gives me great joy.

Susanne highlight quilts from the Fly Me to the Moon collection which celebrates the Apollo missions and all things lunar. You will enjoy the stories behind the quilts and the artists who made them.

Artists from 8 countries have created art quilts celebrating Man's First Walk on the Moon. This multifaceted collection includes quilts that: commemorate the iconic images from the news; recall personal memories of July 20, 1969; honor all of the Apollo Missions; recognize all of the Apollo Astronauts; investigate scientific moon images; examine NASA's cool tools; explain myths associated with the moon; define moon idioms; replay the music inspired by the moon; visit pop culture icons; and make us fall in love again under the romantic moon. All of the quilts in this collection are 18"wide and 30" long and were juried to be a cohesive exhibit. Although the quilts are varied in style, the theme is always the same, the moon.

Step into style with this unique and creative workshop. In this class, you'll learn how to turn a simple quilted sandwich made from fat quarters into a fabulous, one-of-a-kind pair of quilted sneakers.

From the sole up, you'll stitch, shape, and strut your way through the process, walking away with handmade kicks that are as bold and original as you are!

You can choose from high-tops, classics, or low-tops. The soles are available in European sizes, ranging from 36 to 47, and come in black or white.

Susanne will provide all the necessary materials for this class, except for your machine and sewing essentials. Soles will be ordered ahead of time at the cost of \$60 per pair. Please don't ask for smaller than 36 or larger than 47. They don't have them.

We'll provide you with a form that needs to be returned to us a month before class to ensure Susanne has the soles in time.

America is preparing to celebrate the signing of the Declaration of Independence and Bayside Quilters is going to be part of that celebration. How do we celebrate? With quilts, of course! Talbot County Free Library is our partner. If you saw the brochure and exhibit last year you know they do a great job of featuring our art.

America250, chaired by Rosie Rios, is the official commission designated by Congress to organize

the commemoration (america250.org). To quote Ms. Rios, "That ongoing journey to become more perfect is exactly what we are commemorating and hopefully planting the seed for an even longer journey and a longer conversation about who we want to be as a country."

After discussing the project with Scotti from TCFL we think the following will work for Bayside and the library.

Exhibit Time Frame: June 1 through July 31, 2026. Staging on May 29, 2026.

Color and Size: Red, white, blue, tan, gold or other colors that you would be appropriate to give to a Veteran, maybe a Maryland flag quilt. For hanging quilts, no longer than 72". Entry forms will be the same as the last exhibit. Photo and brief description for a brochure will be required. Smaller quilts will be fixed to the wall by pins.

Hospice Donation: You are invited to donate your quilt to a veteran in hospice care once the exhibit is taken down. It will be noted in the brochure.

Spotlight on Outreach

February 2026



Are you getting excited about Bayside's Outreach Day on February 11? If not, you need more information! Instead of a speaker we will have an all-day sew-in to make quilts for Outreach charities. There will be all the usual kits for quilt tops and mammo pillows and plenty of items that need hand sewing. Lunch will be provided and there will be prizes that are sure to please—think gift certificates to your favorite quilt stores!

If you'd like to try something new, you can participate in making a "mystery" quilt top. The mystery is that you won't know what the quilt looks like until the final step when you assemble all the pieces you made in previous steps. You start by picking up a package of fabrics and the first set of instructions. You can work individually or in small teams to create and assemble blocks according to the clues. After you complete the first set of clues, you pick up additional fabric and instructions. You repeat the process until you complete a twin quilt top. If you work in a small team (2-3 people) you should be able to complete a twin quilt top by the end of the day.



All of the twin quilt tops that we make on Outreach Day will be donated to the Paul Newman Hole in the Wall Gang camp, (holeinthewallgang.org), a new facility that is opening in Queenstown in May 2026. This camp will provide children with rare diseases the opportunity to have a camp experience—and every child will receive a quilt.

January was a tough month for traveling, and we had to cancel the Outreach sewing day at Immanuel Lutheran. We are stubbornly optimistic that we will be able to meet on February 25, 10 am – 3 pm. Join your quilting sisters and spend some time with us as we sew for the community.

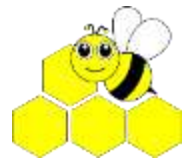
- First class: Saturday, February 21 with leader, Kin West. We will be making an embroidered block.

Embellishments must stay within the 20-
inch size. Items must withstand packing,
shipping and handling many times. Items
allowed: beads, ribbon, buttons, charms,
etc. NO glitter allowed (comes off and
damages other quilts) NO dangling
materials (could get caught and tear).

Digital submission will require three
photos, a 3-4 sentence artist statement,
and payment of a \$25 entry fee

Quilts will be returned by July 1, 2026.

If selected for the exhibition, you will be
notified by email and provided further
instruction on mailing your piece.

Multiple Entries are permitted.
